Convenor's Report	<p>It's been another busy year with a wide variety of issues.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * CMAL. We have been consulted on the pier upgrade and work is now beginning to move forward, scheduled to begin in July. Dog fouling has been a recurring theme throughout the year. CCTV has been installed and people are encouraged to report if they see it being allowed by dog owners. * Windfarms. CGDT windfarm proposal for two caused a lot of anxiety with people in the community both for and against. Planning was refused Ardtaraig windfarm proposal for ten turbines is still at an early stage with further community consultation planned for the autumn. * Argyll & Bute Council. Kilbridemore Bridge closure to heavy vehicles has been making life difficult for people on the West Road, especially as they now have to take their rubbish & recycling to the Clachan. Generally, bin collection has moved to a 2-3 weekly cycle and is raising some issues that will need to be monitored. * Resilience Group. Martin MacFarlane has decided to stand down and is being replaced by Morag Shiveral. Martin will still act as an advisor. Other group members are DS, CG, Annie Craig and Sara MacLean. * Broadband provision is not progressing as fast as we would wish but it is moving forward. * PC Grant has regularly attended meetings and given updates and advice. He has taken back the community's concerns on various matters and raised them for action. * CGDT. The development trust is still moving forward with the The Clachan Hub project. Kilmodan Acre Trust hosted a meeting where all parties involved in accessing the field were able to share what they are doing and raise any concerns and pleas for support. The Cowal Way is now one of Scotland's Great Trails with 40% increase in footfall. * Auchnagarron Forest Scoping. There was a lot of concern about the detail - road exits, stacking and turning area for lorries. No further feedback has been received to date. * The first community payback money has been received from Bute Estates for the hydro scheme in Milton Burn. A Community Council Finance Committee is being established to manage the funds. * Health & Social Care. CG has taken on the remit of representing our area. It has not been an easy remit and Cathy has done a sterling job attending meetings and keeping us up-to-date with issues.
